

## DIY Headbanz Game

**Elect:** 1.1 Friendship - Playing Group Games.

1.2 Conflict Resolution and Social Problem-Solving Skills - Making logical connections between actions and consequences.

4.5 Inquiry – Observing and forming a question, collecting information, evaluating and readjusting.

In our class we had been playing Headbanz quite often, we have so much fun that I thought you might want to make your own and show your parents how to play. So many of you are such great artists, I can't wait to see what you come up with!



### **Materials:**

- Paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Printer (optional)
- yarn/elastic string/hairbands (you will need one for each player)
- Cardstock/construction paper
- Packing Tape (optional)

### **Instructions:**

- You can either print some images out or draw them (drawing them is more fun!) Things like, a tree, a boat, a house, various animals, various food or fruits and veggies. The original game has 72 cards, but you can add more as you need, I suggest starting with 10-20
- Label what each card is, for example if you draw a snowman, write "I am a snowman"
- Cut each image out into cards of the same size
- Glue the image onto cardstock/construction paper to make it sturdier and not see through.
- To make your game even more durable, you can cover the cards with packing tape.



**\*\*You're all done, now let's play!\*\***

### **Rules of Play:**

- Place the cards face down in the center of the playing area. Each player takes a headband /elastic string/hairband. If you don't have any of these you can use a bit of tape to tape it onto your forehead.
- Deal one card **face down** to each player.
- Without looking at the picture side of the card, put the card into your headband so all the other players can see the picture.
- Youngest player goes first, then play continues to the left.
- On your turn, and ask each of the other players a question that will help you identify the picture on your head. Once you've asked all of the players a question you can take one guess as to who you are.
- Game is over when the first person guesses their card correctly.
- You cannot ask "what am i?" Questions you **CAN** ask should be answered by "yes" or "no", some examples are:
  - Am I edible
  - Am I big/small
  - Do I have legs
  - Can I fly
  - Am I human
  - Am I sweet
