# **Spinal Spinner**

### Materials:

- art paper/thick paper
- scissors
- string/yarn

- markers
- hole puncher

## Instructions:

- 1. Draw a circle on paper and cut out the circle.
- 2. Starting in the center, draw a spiral to fill the circle. (No need for perfection)
- 3. Draw or color the circle on one side or both sides.
- 4. Cut carefully along the spinal line.
- 5. Punch a small hole in the center of the spiral, thread a piece of string/yarn through, and tie a knot.
- 6. Hang the spinner outside onto a tree branch and observe it spinning with breeze.

# Pinwheel Spinner

## **Materials:**

- art paper/thick paper
- small wooden dowel/pencil
- brass fastener

- glue stick
- hole punch
- scissors

## Instructions:

- 1. Cut paper into a square about 6"X6"/15cmX15cm.
- 2. Fold the square along a diagonal line, then unfold it. Repeat this with the other diagonal line.
- 3. Cut along each fold from the corner towards the center and leave at least 1"/2.5cm not cut.
- 4. Fold the corner to the left of one cut into the center and glue the corner onto the center making sure that there is enough space for making a hole later. Repeat this step for the other three cut.
- 5. When the glue is dry, punch a hole in the center. Make sure that you puncture all four folded corners.
- 6. Slide a brass fastener through the hole and wrap the ends of the brass fastener around the wooden dowel/pencil. (Cut off the pointing end of the dowel and tape it if it's needed.)
- 7. Blow the pinwheel spinner or play with it outside.
